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Year Group Welcome Letters

We hope that you found the opportunity to meet your child's new teacher at the end of last term useful; it is always important to be able to put a name to a face. All staff will be out on the playground over the next couple of weeks at the end of the day so please take the opportunity to introduce yourself to them if you haven't already.

The systems in place in each year group will vary slightly as the children get older and move up the school. Every year group is producing an information letter for parents which outlines key information including details of homework, equipment needed and the days on which the children will be having PE. These will be sent out via ParentMail at the end of the week and will be put on the school website. The website also includes other useful information about how you can help your child at home with the phonics pages being especially useful for parents of children in Lower School.



Homework

This year we would like to have a significant push on reading, spelling and learning number facts as the core elements of homework. All children should be reading regularly at home and we would be grateful if parents could continue to spend time reading with their child each week.

The children will also have spellings / high frequency words to take home and learn and should either be practising their counting skills, number bonds to 10 and then 20 or their times tables (depending on their age and stage of development) each week as well. Parents often ask what they can do to support their children at home – focusing on these areas would be a tremendous help.

These core skills will then be supplemented by additional maths, English or topic tasks, further details of which will be outlined in the Year Group Welcome Letters. We will be moving to an online system of maths homework across the school this year and further details of this will be sent out in due course.

Clubs

The club timetable will also be distributed shortly. This term we are able to offer a variety of clubs across the year groups. Our clubs are very popular and it is not always possible to include all those who apply. However, staff running the club will rotate the groupings throughout the year in order to allow as many children as possible to attend.

Monday saw the auditions for this year's Young Voices choir. We are very much looking forward to taking those children successful in gaining a place up to the O2 in January.

Please assist our staff, many of whom run clubs on a voluntary basis, by ensuring that you arrive on time to collect your child from an after school activity.

Please remember that an information evening for all parents regarding applying for a place at Secondary School will be held on Thursday 14th September at 7.00. Parents should keep an eye out for the dates of Secondary School Open Days and Information Evenings.

Summer Building Work

Over the summer, the school has been a hive of industry with a substantial amount of building and maintenance work taking place as well as a lot of hard work from the staff to get classrooms set up and ready for the start of the new year. Following a successful bid for Conditions Improvement Funding from the Department for Education we have been able to install Velux windows in the hall, Year R and Year 1 classrooms which will provide some much needed ventilation in these parts of the school. Further improvement to the school includes repairs to the floors and replacement carpets in 7 of our Middle and Upper School classrooms and the installation of a new server to improve the operation of our school IT systems.

Reception Outside Area



Thank you to everyone who made a donation to our Reception outside area at the end of last year. Our Reception team and several parents have worked hard over the summer to make great use of all the items received. The children now have a new and improved mud kitchen, a stage and performance area, a fantastic pirate ship sand pit and an exciting area for construction. Please have a look over the fence as you come into school in the morning. These improvements will help to support our children with all areas of their learning and development. I am sure that they will find this an exciting place to be and will have lots of fun!

Site Safety

In order to enable our youngest children to be seen safely into and out of their classrooms, we will be closing the gate nearest to the school building which separates the two playgrounds at the start and end of each day. The gate beyond the pirate ship should be used to move from the small playground to the large playground.
