


Ladybirds and Butterflies Homework Trail (Term 4 2026)

<p>Draw, sketch or paint a picture of Samuel Pepys.</p>	<p>Pretend that you are witnessing the Great Fire of London and write a news report or a diary entry for each day that the fire blazed through the city.</p>	<p>Explore or draw a map of London, before and after the fire. How has it changed? Can you draw a before and after map or show some landmark buildings around the Thames? How did they change?</p>
<p>What landmarks do you recognise in London today? Can you recreate one using Lego or junk modelling etc? Take a photo for your book and explain how you made it.</p>	<p>Can you find a book or poem about The Great Fire of London? Read it with someone at home, then choose your favourite part. You could record yourself reading it aloud and share it with your friends at school.</p>	<p>Build a bridge to cross the River Thames. Is it steady enough to carry a toy car?</p>
