Off on the trail... 

You must complete three squares in a row, passing vertically, horizontally or diagonally through the middle square.

## Weekly homework tasks

### Reading

Read for at least 10 minutes, three times a week. This could be your school reading book or a book from home.

### Mathletics and Time Tables

A task will set on Mathletics each week. You can use the games and challenges available on Mathletics as often as you like. The more, the better! Practice the times tables facts that have been sent home.

### Spellings

Have a look at and learn the words from the front of your homework book and practice regularly. Have a look at the high frequency word lists that can be found on the [school website](#). Select the list that contains words that you know you need to practise to enhance your writing.

This year we set up our new Climate Action Crew to help our environment. Think about how you can encourage wildlife into your garden or balcony. Perhaps make a bird feeder, a bug hotel, or plant some flowers to attract bees or other insects.

In January, we made dots to create a fantastic rainbow wall display. Have a go at creating a rainbow of your own. This might be rainbow bubbles made from washing up liquid, creating a rainbow from a prism or a fantastic piece of rainbow artwork.

Over the Easter holiday, Mr Rowson made an amazing outdoor stage area for us. Have a go at making up a play or creating a performance of your own. Get family to join in with you at home. You could get your friends involved in a performance on our outdoor stage,

Create an outdoor activity to help practice times tables or counting skills. This could be a treasure hunt, or an obstacle course where numbers are involved. Play your activity several times to help develop these maths skills.

Fill in the postcard attached to Miss Talbot and your teacher telling them about the things on your trail you have completed.

This year Sir David Attenborough celebrated his 100th birthday. Do something to celebrate his amazing career in wildlife. Perhaps visit a park or nature area, research information about your favourite animal or make a model inspired by wildlife. It's up to you.

Our new cycle and scooter shed encourages everyone to ditch the car when coming to school. Create a poster to show the importance of walking scootering or cycling to school.

Create a game, design a quiz, or make a puppet or model linked to one of your favourite books. Get family or friends involved in playing this with you. Talk about the story and the characters in this book.

Plan a new OPAL play activity that you would like to see outside. This might be a new type of game or a special area. Tell one of the Outdoor Play Team or someone at home about your idea.
